Thank you for all your support during our theme of Keeping Healthy, Keeping Safe. The children have really enjoyed learning about the jobs that you all do to keep us healthy and safe. As we move into Springtime, we would love the children to experience how to care for a baby animal – a chick, a kid, a piglet, a rabbit or whatever animal that would be safe for the children see and handle! The visit of a tractor would also go down well with the children. Please see your child's class teacher if you could help us out with this.

THEME: GROWING AND MY 5 SENSES

We will be preparing the vegetable and herb gardens for our Spring planting activities. The children will be planting cress or mustard seeds as these grow quickly! We will also be planting pansies and primroses and fresh herbs such as parsley, thyme and lavender. In the raised beds, we will be tending to the fruit bushes and will be planting young strawberry plants and growing beans, carrots, potatoes and peas!



We will also be enjoying some themed Easter activities including an Easter Egg Hunt and making some chocolate nests to enjoy for snack!

We will be learning about our sense of smell, hearing, sight, taste and touch by trying out some experiments e.g. feely bag, identifying sounds, making a musical instrument etc.



We will also be learning about what happens on the farm and in the pond in Springtime. Please follow our posts on your child's learning journey on Seesaw to see the progress that he / she is making.

TEACHING OUR CHILDREN TO KEEP SAFE

The safety of our school community is paramount. The school carpark is extremely busy especially at morning drop off time. As we encourage our children to make good choices about their personal safety, please demonstrate good road safety to them. Please remember to:

- Drive round the one-way system and to drive slowly, taking due care and consideration for other drivers and for our nursery and primary school children.
- Please park in the lay-bys or carpark to drop off and pick up your child.
- Hold your child's hand at all times until he / she is safely in the car / bus!
- Check that your child walks on the 'inside' rather than the 'roadside' of the footpath.
- Use footpaths and the raised crossings to cross the road (with zebra crossing).
- Be extra careful crossing the lane and using the path at the side of the school as traffic enters and exits from this area.
- Take extra care in the ice and snow, and look out for the warning signs around the campus.
- Wear sturdy footwear suitable suitable for indoor and outdoor play (no laces please).



Please share this important information with anyone who drops off / collects your child. We will be having a parent come into school to talk about road safety with the children.


CASE FOR CHANGE
