PARENTAL BALLOT GOING LIVE SOON!

This will be posted by 'Civica Election Services' (CES) to all those with Parental Responsibility for a child currently registered at Magherafelt Nursery School, using the postal address information you recently provided. If you don't receive these papers by Wednesday 15th, please let us know. Background information about the ballot will be included along with the ballot paper. We would urge all parents to respond to this ballot - tick Yes or No, then post it back to CES in the Freepost envelope provided, as soon as possible. The last date for receipt of ballots by CES is 5pm on Tuesday 28th June.

If you have any questions about Integration, a representative from the Integrated Education Fund will be present at school next Tuesday/Wednesday (at the Teddy Bear's Picnic - see later in this newsletter!) to help answer your questions.

GETTING READY FOR PRIMARY ONE



PRE-SCHOOLERS AND YOUNGER CHILDREN

Your child's nursery year is a special one. Each child will take home his / her 'All About Me' booklet and a selection of paintings and drawings from across the terms.

PRE-SCHOOLERS: TRANSITION ARRANGEMENTS

The Year one teacher from the primary school your child will be starting has been invited to visit the nursery school to meet with your child. We look forward to these visits on Tuesday 21st, Wednesday 22nd and Thursday 23rd June.

We will be setting up a 'School Uniform and Shoe Shop' and 'Primary One classroom' for the children to role-play the move to 'big school'. We will also be displaying photographs of all the primary schools. If you have any spare small jumpers or polo shirts with the primary school logo or school shoes, (from a sibling or family member), please send them into school for the children to dress up in.

We will be sharing stories with the children about starting a new school including 'Whiffy Wilson – The Wolf who Didn't Want to Go to School!' We will also be talking to the children about making new friends and bringing the children who will be attending the same school together.

TRANSITION REPORTS

Towards the end of June, you will receive a transition report for your child. This report will contain information about your child's strengths and interests and will detail the progress he / she has made across the NI Pre-School Curriculum. The teachers have carefully documented the learning of your child throughout the year and this has been shared on your child's 'Seesaw' folder. The class teacher will be happy to talk to you should you wish to discuss any area of the report. In the interest of a smooth progression in learning, a copy of this report will also be shared with your child's primary school. Should you prefer that this report is not shared with the primary school, please inform the school in writing by Monday 27th June.

INDUCTION ARRANGEMENTS FOR PRIMARY ONE

We are aware that many primary schools have organised Induction Meetings for the children to attend. Should the times overlap with the nursery setting times, please let the class teacher know. It is important for your child to attend these meetings so that they become familiar with their new setting.

YOUNGER CHILDREN: PROGRESS REPORTS

Towards the end of June, you will receive a progress report for your child. This report will contain information about your child's strengths and interests and will detail the progress he / she has made across the Being Two and Three Programme. The teachers have carefully documented the learning of your child throughout the year and this has been shared on your child's 'Seesaw' folder. We look forward to the return of these children as 'pre-schoolers' and hope that those children who are transferring to other pre-school settings settle in quickly.

CHILDREN WITH INDIVIDUAL LEARNING PLANS

The class teacher will make telephone contact with you to review the targets that have been set for your child. With your verbal consent, a copy of the most recent plan will also be forwarded to the relevant primary school. This sharing of information is important for the needs of your child to be met in their new school.
